




Find the Glastonbury Tourist Information Centre, get your ticket at the counter, and go upstairs.




Stop on the Landing - draw in the carvings you can see in the corners of one of the doorways.



Panels 7, 8 and 9 (and 4)

Draw the lake village house that Arthur Bulleid made.




As you go round, find out what was inside the houses.
